




Enforcement Workgroup Recommendation #1 (Short Term)








Enforcement Workgroup Recommendation #1, cont'd (Short Term)



- Governor announces law
- Governor directs all state agencies to notify constituents
- share news with stakeholders






Enforcement Workgroup Recommendation #2 (Long Term)

- The Task Force should implement goals of House Joint Resolution 622, which called for a study of the efficacy of diversion program for drug offenders
- The Task Force should identify another entity to conduct a study into the efficacy of diversion for 2nd and 3rd time felony drug abusers, and the potential financial savings to the Commonwealth






Enforcement Workgroup Recommendation #3 (Long Term)

- As a matter of policy, if the state determines incarceration is an appropriate punishment for addicts who have continued contact with the criminal justice system, the Task Force should recommend treatment options be made available during confinement.






Enforcement Workgroup - Status of Accepted Recommendations

- Storage & Disposal Referral: Work with Education Group to develop communication plan to increase law enforcement awareness of disposal opportunities (in progress)
- Education Referral: Develop law enforcement training on administration of Naloxone (in progress)
